

If I wanted to understand the world of business and computers and I could ask anyone, who would I ask? I would ask Bill Gates, the creator of Microsoft, the world's largest software company. How about if I wanted to know how the Hubble telescope works? I would ask the creators of the telescope. If I wanted to know the answer to some of life's problems, who should I ask? Once we recognize that one of the ways God has chosen to speak to us is through the written word, we can then safely know that when we go to the Bible, we are hearing the words of God. And since He created life, who better to teach us about it?
